#### Round 7

In the 7<sup>th</sup> round chess of high caliber was played by several programs. Many of the games were too difficult to analyze on the spot. Fortunately, nowadays we are privileged that the computer programs support us in the analysis so that we could see where it went wrong and for what reasons. Zappa played Junior. It was a well known Slav variant with the Kasparov move 7. g4. This was the start of an exciting game. Junior reacted quite modestly and hoped that the aggressive play of white would backfire. However, Zappa was aggressive at two sides; namely on the Queenside with Queen and Knight and on the Kingside with Rook and Knight. For those who do not know the theory the main line was in Zappa's book up to move 20 although we must remark that Zappa went out of book once and returned into the book the move thereafter. Junior did not play obviously weak moves but the moves 23. ... Rh6 and 25. ... b5 were criticized by Zappa. Especially 23. ... Rh6 should be replaced by 23. ... Rg6. The evaluation at both sides concurred and was around equal. In the game it was totally different. Zappa moved the Pawn to d5 and later to d6. That was crucial since now the square d5 became available for the Knight, Rook, Bishop and the Queen. It was a flood of white pieces which penetrated the black fortress. Many walls fell down and Amir Ban would not like to see the end. He resigned in time. This result led to a big gap of 1.5 point between Zappa (No. 1 with 6.5 points) and three runner-up programs (with 5 points).

Fruit lost connection with the top by a lost against Diep. It was an interesting game with an unbalanced material exchange. White had two Rooks and Black a Queen which had a large activity over the whole board. However, Diep managed to free its Rooks and to exchange pawns in such a way that Black's position resulted in a configuration with many weak points. They were an easy victim for the white Rooks. At the end White announced mate in 35. This misstep by Fruit was exploited by Deep Sjeng and Shredder. Both won their game after a long lasting fight. In the game IsiChess vs. The Baron we saw an unknown variant played from book up to a unbalanced position which was assessed as equal. Many humans fail to see why but the programs knew what they were doing. After hard struggle material became equal as was the case with the positions. Both sides made several attempts to change this but the result was unavoidable, a draw. Crafty won against Futé and climbed in the standings to a middle position.
